
Extempore Speech Competition by Department of English



A REPORT ON DEBATE COMPETITION

Dated: 25-08-2022

Name of the activity: A Debate Competition on the motion "Shakespeare is no longer relevant."

Details of the activity: In keeping with the academic calendar 2021-22, a debate competition was held in department of English, Jagannath Singh College, Udharbond on 25/08/2022. The motion of the debate was "Shakespeare is no longer relevant to present society" in which some of the students took part for the motion and some of them were against the motion.

The students who took part against the motion told about Shakespeare and his contribution to English and world literature, his popularity and his influence on later poets and dramatist. They also argued how Shakespeare's dramas are adapted in films and translated into various languages, his quotations and soliloquies used in day to day life.

Students who were for the motion then contended the statement saying that though Shakespeare contributed to English literature a lot, but none of his writing are original. Shakespeare sourced his plots and characters from historical accounts and classical texts. They also argued that the language in which Shakespeare wrote is referred to as Early Modern English which is not relevant today. The bombastic phrases that Shakespeare used in his writing are not understood by common men. The characters of his plays especially tragedies were the higher class people: the Kings, Queens and Princes etc and therefore their pain and suffering is unable to touch the rustic common people. To say in one word, his writing is all about the people of higher class and he is a great writer only for scholars.

Dr.Susmita Mitra, Assistant Professor, Dept. of English, who judged the debate, appreciated the participants who had put forward their own views on Shakespeare. Altogether four students having DSC English as subject took part in the competition and 33 students from other departments took part as audience. Each of the competitors tried their best to establish their views which was well enjoyed by the audience and the judge as well. Pooja Roy of TDC 2nd semester was awarded as the best debater in the competition.

Name of the activity:- Educational trip to a place of historical interest.


